

- Founded by Canada and South Africa
- Based on need to develop broader global consensus on mining and SD
- Flows from 2002 UN summit on sustainable development and recognition of positive and negative potentials of mining in relation to SD

- Restructured in 2015
- International Institute for Sustainable Development (IISD) named as Secretariat
  - Grow membership
  - Manage international outreach
  - MPF Assessment process and capacity building
  - Demand driven training and support

- Focuses on mining and sustainable development
- Mining and SD Policy Framework: 6 Pillars
  - Legal and policy environment (Governance)
  - Financial benefit optimization (Policy and admin.)
  - Socioeconomic benefit optimization (Development benefits, Local inputs, downstream, etc., SLO)
  - Environmental Management
  - Post mining transition (Closure, legacy mines)
  - ASM (Economic and social development)

#### Services to Global Community:

- Forum for discussion and policy development (does not create obligations for member states)
- Multi-stakeholder approach to dialogue
- All areas within MPF
- Annual meeting in Geneva in October has 275-300 participants from government, civil society, industry and academia
- Outreach in other fora:
  - Eg: Mining Indaba in Cape Town

  - MPF Assessments
    - Governance reviews
    - Working with WB MINGOV program
  - Demand-based support and capacity building
