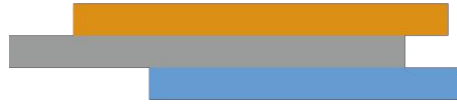

Background of the organizer

The workshops are organized by STRADE, (Strategic Dialogue on Sustainable Raw Materials for Europe) an EU-funded research project focusing on the development of dialogue-based, innovative policy recommendations for a European strategy on future raw materials supplies.

STRADE addresses the long-term security and sustainability of the European raw-material supply from European and non-European countries. Using a dialogue-based approach, the project brings together governments, industry and civil society to deliver policy recommendations for an innovative European strategy on future EU mineral raw-material supplies.

The project holds environmental and social sustainability as its foundation in its approach to augmenting the security of the European Union mineral raw-material supply and enhancing competitiveness of the EU mining industry.

Over a three year period (2016-2018), the STRADE Consortium of 7 independent partners – Oeko-Institute (Germany), SNL Financial (Sweden), Projekt-Consult (Germany), University of Dundee (UK), Georange (Sweden), University of Witwatersrand (South Africa), DMT Kai Batla (South Africa) – brings together practical experience, legislation, best-practice technologies and know-how by addressing:

- Strengthening the European raw-materials sector
- A European cooperation strategy with resource-rich countries
- Internationally sustainable raw-material production & supply
